## Call for Papers

Tourism is an economic phenomenon related to the movement of people to places outside their usual environment for personal or business/professional purposes. As such, tourism has implications for the economy, for the natural and built environment, for the local population at the destination and for visitors themselves. Thus, tourism should be understood more precisely as a phenomenon occurring unevenly across a 'territory', be it a country, region, municipality or any other territorial entity. The close link between tourism and territory exists not only because the natural or built territory is often the main tourism attraction (an exotic beach, a vibrant city), but also because the territory, and displacements across it, largely condition tourism trips, the nature of the supply that caters to visitor consumption and, consequently, the relationship to potential welfare.

Therefore, among this complex overlapping network of elements, this second edition hopes to share knowledge, experience and ideas, as well as to advance a second reflection on certain specific themes:

Theme 1: Policies for Seizing the Economic Potential of Tourism Destinations

Theme 2: New Technologies and Innovation: Empowering Regional Tourism Stakeholders

Theme 3: Linking Regional Economics, Mobility and Tourism in Applied Research

An additional objective is to encourage further innovative and in-depth analysis in order to overcome existing barriers in the measurement and economic analysis of tourism at the regional/local level, and to move the agenda forward on designing more efficient policies. ## SUBMISSION OF PAPERS

Research papers are invited and will be rigorously evaluated for novelty, significance, and soundness. Papers should clearly state the background, introduction, purpose, theory / issues, methodology, results, conclusions and managerial / industry / social implications of the study, and be fully referenced with appropriate citations. The first round of revision conducted by MOVE 2011 Scientific Committee will be based on extended abstracts, once some are selected, the committee will request the authors to submit the full paper.

### 1. All papers must be submitted in English

2. **Extended abstract** (1 – 2 pages) should be written with the aim of making it interesting and comprehensible to participants in general and not only to specialists in the topic. **It must follow 'CFP\_exAB\_template' format.**

3. **Full papers** (10-20 pages) must not exceed a maximum of TWENTY pages (when typed with 1-spaced in 10 point Cambria font on standard A4 sheets).

- All submitted material (text, tables, graphs and figures) must be compiled in one file, Word (doc or docx).
- *Title Page including the following information:*
  - *Subtitle: Name and number of Research Area (Number, title) (if other, please specify)*
  - *Name(s) of the author(s) (first name, last name)*
  - *Institution, department, position*
  - *Street Address*
  - *City, country*
  - *E-mail address, telephone, fax*
- *References: all references should be in alphabetical order, indicated in the text by name(s) of the author(s) and the year of publication in round parentheses.*

Extended abstract submission deadline: **July 31<sup>st</sup> 2011**

Notification of pre-Acceptance of extended abstract: **Sept 9<sup>th</sup> 2011**

Final acceptance of full papers: **Sept 23<sup>th</sup> 2011**

Registration deadline: **October 7<sup>th</sup> 2011**

Conference MOVE 2011: **October 27-29<sup>th</sup> 2011**

*The **date for full-paper submission** will be determined by the scientific committee and accordingly communicated to authors of the selected extended abstracts.*

*Accepted papers* will be included in the Conference website and published after the Conference. There is also a possibility that some will be selected by Turespaña of Spain's Ministry of Industry, Tourism and Commerce for publication in a special Spanish edition as well as in future INRouTe documentation.
